History

The Intermodal Transportation Center (ITC) opened in January 2002 immediately following the extension of the Trinity Railway Express service to downtown Fort Worth, with a vision to provide a convenient centralized, hub for multiple forms of public ground transportation, with spacious waiting rooms and customer counters. Passengers may make one stop for connections to local or long distance bus and train travel, cabs or rental cars.

Transportation Services

- Largest transfer center for The T bus system to Fort Worth area destinations, including cultural district, universities, shopping, employment and medical centers.
- The Trinity Railway Express operates between Fort Worth and Dallas with 40 daily train stops at its ITC station.
- Molly the Trolley 7-day free downtown circulator loop is only 2 blocks from the ITC; Saturday service directly to and from Stockyards is \$1.50 each way.
- Greyhound offers daily schedules to 2,500 destinations across North America.
- Amtrak trains stopping at the ITC to and from the north, south and east connect to more than 500 destinations nationwide.
- Enterprise Rent-a-car averages a monthly rental of 200 cars.
- Yellow Cab and Cowboy Cab stop regularly at the ITC.
- A Kiss and Ride drop off lane and nearby commercial parking make access convenient.
- Travelers Aid desk Mon.-Sat. provides emergency assistance, referral to area services and accommodations and other traveler information and resources.
- The Convention and Visitors bureau offers tourist information at a kiosk in the lobby.

Community Room

About 8,000 people annually use the ITC's community room for meetings and events.

Historic Landmarks – lobby kiosk offers access to trolley and audio tour of Historic Wall

- Restored trolley used on Interurban line between Fort Worth and Dallas.
- Artist Historic Wall dedicated to site of 1860's African-American marketplace.
